### From the Vicar

Every few years, four to be precise, we experience an "intercalary year" or "bissextile year" in which a day is added to the calendar at the end of February. We all, of course, know this as a "leap year." It's a clever and simple solution to an interesting problem. The seasons and astronomical events of our solar system do not fit perfectly into our neatly designed Gregorian calendar. An astronomical year lasts a smidge longer than 365 days and a hair shorter than 365 1/4 days. By slotting in an extra day every few years the gap resulting from the slow drift of the solar system's natural clock away from civilization's own

ingenious time keeping system can be reset.

Having winter in winter and summer in summer and Easter at Easter is wonderful thing. But beyond the pleasantness of having events occur when they should, there is an interesting reminder that leap years impart. A humbling take-away, if you will. God's universe and all that God has made and called good is both within human understanding and outside of it. We've become amazing at describing it, constructing models of it, tracking the movements of it, predicting outcomes based on mathematical formulas, and using all of those skills to invent machines that can stretch those findings, computations, and insights far into the future. Yet there remains a gap we cannot close. For all of humanity's astonishing accomplishments we are still a bit like children playing in God's sandbox while a stone's throw away there is a beach and an ocean so beautiful and vast that we can scarcely imagine it. This combination of an ability to understand and to know coupled with limitation is, truly, a comforting and grace-filled reality.

As Holy Week approaches so does God's grace in a uniquely emotional and powerful way. If one undertakes a journey through Holy Week one will walk the way of the cross and come face-to-face with the crucified Lord. One will come face-to-face with one's own limitations and failings and find that God himself has taken those limitations and failings upon his shoulders. By entering into our world, by living and dying as one of us, God has closed the gap and put our world right side up again. In telling this story year after year, and enacting it through the events of Holy Week, we rediscover the greatest truth of our lives: God is love and in Christ God has closed the gap.

At times we come to the events of Holy Week and Easter desperately wanting to feel something or be moved in a particular way. And sometimes we are. And sometimes we aren't. And both are ok. The beauty and grace of the liturgy and the worship of the church, especially in this season, is that it doesn't depend on us. Like a sturdy seat or a firm foundation it can hold us and support our lives, however we come to it.

May the prayers of the church and the power of God's truth and the peace that surpasses understanding surround you and envelope you as it will.

I hope that you will be able to join in worship and fellowship throughout these holy days. Each one of these worship services will enrich our Lenten experience and hopefully, bring an understanding of the amazing love that our Lord has for each one of us. To share that understanding, you may consider inviting a family member or your neighbor to join into our fellowship.

There will be a small change to the schedule during Holy Week. Instead of the traditional Wednesday Tenebrae ceremony, Saint Aidan's will offer a Taize service. This contemplative worship service and the music of Taize, along with candles glowing throughout the sanctuary, will offer a quiet time of renewal and self-reflection.

May God bless YOUR Lenten journey! I trust that He'll slow mine down!


